Ms. Kristy Leach is TDMHSAS' new Director of Children and Youth Mental Health and Ms. Kisha Ledlow has transitioned from Federal Grants Manager to Project Director for Tennessee's Healthy Transi-**Kristy and Kisha** tions Initiative. As Director of Children and Youth Mental Health, Ms.

Leach has oversight of a continuum of state and mental health block grant funded children and youth programs in addition to the Nashville Regional Intervention Program (RIP) and RIP expansion programs. In addition, she has oversight of the K-Town Youth Empowerment Network as well as three additional system of care grants and the Tennessee Healthy Transitions Initiative. Ms. Leach has over 21 years of experience in mental health management and service provider roles, including the following: therapist, case manager, day treatment provider, and a director of a team of 62 staff. Through her experience as the Director of Children and Youth Services at a community mental health center for 10 years in Jackson, Mississippi, she gained valuable system of care experience. She supervised staff from a system of care grant titled COMPASS (Children

of Mississippi and their Parents Accessing Strength-based Services) and assisted in obtaining a Safe Schools/ Healthy Students (SS/HS) grant awarded to the Jackson Public School District in 2009 and subsequently par-

ticipated as the local mental health expert on required SS/HS community councils.

Ms. Ledlow has begun as Project Director for Tennessee's Healthy Transitions Initiative (a 5 year \$5 million grant awarded to TDMHSAS by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration). In her former role, Ms. Ledlow served as the Statewide System of Care Technical Assistance Coordinator and Grants Manager of federal grants for TDMHSAS. As Grants Manager, she was responsible for the oversight of contractual, operational, programmatic, and fiscal procedures for multiple SAMHSA system of care grants. Ms. Ledlow has valuable experience working within a system of care for children's mental health, as well as administration over several systems of care grants, including an extensive involvement with a system of care for transition-age youth and young adults. We are excited about Kristy and Kisha's accomplishments and ask that you join us in welcoming them to their new roles with TDMHSAS.

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Trainings & Events

NAMI Basics—is a free, 6-week education program for parents and family caregivers of children and teens whom are experiencing symptoms of a mental illness or whom have already been diagnosed. NAMI Basics is offered in a group setting so caregivers can connect with other people face-to-face. Basics' students learn the facts about mental health conditions and how best to support their child at home, at school and when they're getting medical care. Last year, 99% of participants told us they would recommend the program to other parents. The course is taught by a trained team with lived experience—they know what caregivers are going through because they've been there. The 6-session program provides critical strategies for taking care of our children and learning the ropes of recovery. **Basics classes are currently being formed in Shelby, Greenville, Rutherford, and Madison Counties. 
